A Note From Your Pastor, April 2019

he Lord be with you! This is not an easy article to write, and I ask for grace and understanding as we discuss transitions. Beginning July 1, I will be the new pastor at First UMC in La Grange. On that same day, Rev. David McNitzky will become your new Senior Pastor.

The question surrounding this transition is 'why'? I will do my best to explain the rationale behind this move. Let me begin by expressing my gratitude for you and the ministry opportunities at Manchaca. You are an amazing congregation with a compassionate heart for the least, the last, and the lost. Your support for the Youth at Akins experiencing homelessness is evidence of the gospel at work and an example for other churches to follow. You have an amazing staff that works hard to provide effective programing and spiritual growth. I will miss this congregation and the wonderful opportunities you provide to advance the kingdom.

But again, why a change in the senior pastor position? The simple answer is that I believe it is time for Manchaca to receive fresh leadership when it comes to clergy appointments. I asked the Bishop to consider moving me because I felt a new appointment at Manchaca would help the church in its next steps for growth and outreach. Rev. McNitzky is just such a person to fit the needs of Manchaca. For the last 25 years, he served as senior pastor at Alamo Heights UMC in San Antonio. His experience and leadership will be an amazing addition to this congregation.

I thank you for your outpouring of love and support in these past weeks. This was not an easy decision for me to make, but I do so because I believe it is what's best for me and for Manchaca. Again, I ask for grace and understanding.

In my remaining time, I will be working with the Build-Serve-Grow leadership team in Phase 2 of our goal to renovate areas of our church. Our heart and eyes are on the Family Life Center and areas within the main church building. This project has my full support and I humbly ask that you support these noble efforts to make our facilities as inviting and functional as possible. As I ask for your prayers, I am reminded of what the Apostle Paul said to the church in Corinth. Long ago, that church went through a similar time of transition with its leadership. In his final message to the church Paul said, "Keep alert, stand firm in your faith, be courageous, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love." (1 Cor. 16: 13)

y daughter and I have become fans of a show called "Chef's Table." Unlike other cooking shows, "Chef's Table" documents the lives of chefs from around the world, sharing their stories and offering insight into their personal struggles and philosophies. In a recent episode, the chef being documented was female Indian chef

who opened a restaurant, staffed by all women cooks, in London. One of the dishes which the program showed her making was "biryani" which is a rice dish which includes meat and a variety of spices cooked together in a large pot. In this episode the chef, Asma Khan, assemble all the ingredients in the pot then sealed the pot with some sort of bread dough. The dish cooked sealed in the pot, without the chef being able to look in the pot. The chef had to have faith in the cooking process and know when the dish would be completed. Life is sometimes like cooking biryani. All our experiences, thoughts, dreams, relationships, etc., all go into the "pot" we call "life." We really never know how it will turn out, but we have to have faith that the master chef, God, knows the recipe and that all will turn out. One thing I have learned about watching "Chef's Table" is that a skilled chef can take ingredients which we make think ordinary or even incompatible and make a gourmet meal. We might not know exactly how the final product may turn out, but we have to have faith that God knows the recipe.

Holy Thursday Seder Meal, April 18

In Jewish tradition, the Seder relives the enslavement and subsequent Exodus of the Children of Israel from Ancient Egypt. The night in the upper room before Jesus was arrested, the disciples were preparing for the Passover Seder. On Thursday, April 18 at 7 p.m. members of the congregation will gather in the Family Life Center around "family tables" and experience portions of the Seder celebration through readings, songs, and ritual. Good Friday Service and Fauré's "Requiem"

A Requiem Mass is traditionally a mass, or service, that is offered for someone who has died. The name is derived from the first words of the Introit, ("Requiem aeternam" - "Grant them rest eternal") which is often the first movement. On Friday, April 19, the Sanctuary Choir will present Fauré's "Requiem" as part of the Good Friday service. The service will take place in the Sanctuary at 7 p.m.

Children's Choir presents "Fat, Fat Jehoshaphat" April 28

On Sunday, April 28 during the 8:30 and 11 a.m. services the Children's Choir will tell the story of Jehoshaphat. Jehoshaphat is a king who is mentioned in the Old Testament. In Second Chronicles, the story is told of Jehoshaphat and the nation of Judah facing a great conflict. "Fat, Fat Jehoshaphat" is a musical which tells how Jehoshaphat turns his people back to the Lord and helps them keep faith when disaster looms. My friends, may grace and peace be yours in abundance through the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord.

"Giving" is the second most frequently discussed subject in the ministry of Christ, next to teachings of the Kingdom. It is a time of generous giving at our church. Stewardship commitments are being requested this month and our church family is in the midst of a building campaign. This drive is called Build-Serve-Grow because it is much more than just a building fund raiser. We are called to <u>Serve</u> one another and <u>Grow</u> in Christ. This is a time for us to close ranks and grow in stature and in favor with the Lord. It is a time for us to unite in a common cause to rebuild God's temple.

Approximately \$600,000 is required for BSG Phase 2 over a three-year commitment. The scope includes the renovation of the Family Life Center, the main corridors, stair cases and restrooms in the main building.

We are asking our congregation to prayerfully consider an additional or extended pledge. Over \$535,000 has been pledged thus far to address the Phase 1 work already completed. We thank all of you have given sacrificially and the many families that have generously exceeded their original commitment.

Generous givers offer extraordinary gifts to the church that will impact the Lord's work beyond the giver's own lifetime. Sacrificial giving goes beyond just meeting our basic needs. It is more than just repairing our main hallway flooring or addressing a couple of outdated restrooms. We have begun a good work with the beautiful, paid in full, renovation of the Sanctuary. We submit it is God's will to extend the rebuilding efforts to the rest of His house.

So the elders of the Jews continued to build and prosper under the preaching of Haggai the prophet and Zechariah. They finished building the temple according to the command of the God of Israel. Ezra 6:14

The BSG Committee held an information session on March 3rd and will provide additional information after our joint service on March 31st. BSG team members are available to talk to your Sunday School class or other small group, upon request, and members are encouraged to talk to anyone of the BSG team individually, as you feel led. And don't forget our online Feedback Form if you would like to submit questions online.

Here is a timeline of key events that will occur over the next several months:

- March 31st Additional detailed information will be shared
- April 14th Conduct Church Conference to obtain preliminary approval; this will be a vote of church members to move forward with fund raising supporting the proposed renovations
- May 19th Commitment Sunday; we will announce pledges received on May 26th
- June 20th Church Council meets to provide funding approval, based on pledges, and announce date for a final Church Conference
- June 30th Conduct Church Conference to obtain final member approval; this will be a ratification of the funding reviewed and approved by the Church Council

This is an ambitious building campaign, but we can all take comfort in the knowledge that all things are possible through Christ who strengthens us. Through your continued generous giving, we can transform this house of worship, grow in Christ and serve the generations to come.






Can you be a Summer Youth Teacher?

History of the MUMC Scholarship Fund

The MUMC Scholarship Fund began in 1984, when Christine Brown, a longtime MUMC member and retired teacher, was honored by parents of her students. She was recognized with a \$300 check, and her response was "Let's give it back to the children."

Christine had opened Jet Star School after her retirement. These parents wanted to acknowledge her forty years of teaching, devotion to children, and her endless energy, so their \$300 gift was the seed money for the scholarship fund. Christine began to have her famous rummage sales to benefit the scholarship nest egg. She was so successful with her sales, friends and family dubbed her "Queen of the Rummage Sale".

Christine's life revolved around God, her family, MUMC, children, and their educations. Though she is no longer with us, Christine's spirit lives on, and she continues to influence lives through the MUMC Scholarship Fund.

In 1994, another scholarship was added to the MUMC Fund. Janna Banker contributed proceeds from a scholarship established in memory of her husband, Donald. His career had its foundation in an engineering degree from Texas A&M University. After serving in the USAF and working in private industry, he returned to A&M to obtain a master's degree in mathematics, starting a long and distinguished career in education. The majority of his teaching career was spent at McCallum High School in Austin.

Don's passionate belief in higher education and the opportunities it afforded was often the source of his teaching style.

Mathematics was his platform from the very basic algebra to the higher logic of calculus, he urged, pushed, and if necessary, held the

hands of students until they understood.

Like Christine Brown, Don Banker's devotion to teaching and his students was reciprocated with admiration and respect.

This fund began with \$300 in 1984, 35 years ago. Since that time, over \$66,500 has been given in college scholarships to 135 students.

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Did you know that today 195 children in Texas will be victims of abuse or neglect? In one year, more than 70,000 cases of child abuse were



confirmed in Texas. A staggering 1 in 4 girls, and 1 in 6 boys, is sexually abused before their 18th birthdays? (from Children's Advocacy Centers of Texas, Inc.) In 2017, 172 children in Texas died from child abuse. In 2016, Child Protective Services investigated 10,311 child abuse cases in the Austin metro area (Travis, Hays, Williamson, Bastrop and Caldwell), 6,356 in Travis county alone. (from the Austin American-Statesman) The statistics are alarming, but there are things that we can do about it. In honor of Child Abuse Prevention month, we will have several opportunities for you to learn what child abuse is and how we can work together to protect children:

- 1) Check the Children's Ministry blog and Facebook posts where we will post facts, tips, and links throughout the month.
- 2) Pick up a blue ribbon (available in the hospitality area and in the Family Life Center) to wear throughout April to raise awareness and be an advocate for children and strong, healthy families.
- 3) Donate a gently used or new teddy bear or stuffed animal to be given to children in crisis situations, some of whom are being removed from their homes due to abuse or neglect.
- 4) Learn about our Safe Sanctuary policy (found on the children's page of our website--www.ManchacaUMC.org) and become a "Trusted" adult by completing the Safety Certification training through the Rio Texas conference, which will provide a rich education on preventing child abuse in our community and enable you to work in ministry with children, youth and vulnerable adults for 2 years.
