Build•Serve•Grow Phase 2 Update

As you know, on Sunday, July 14th, MUMC held a Church Conference to vote on one of three options for Build-Serve-Grow, Phase 2. These options were proposed by the Trustees and approved by the Church Council during its meeting on June 27, 2019.

After hearing an overview of the three options, the congregation voted to move forward with Option 3. The ballot results are as follows:

<i>Option 3</i>	<i>53%</i>
<i>Option 1</i>	<i>24%</i>
<i>Option 2</i>	<i>23%</i>

Option 3 includes renovations to the Family Life Center (FLC), Main Corridor ceiling, lighting and paint, west side Main Corridor Restrooms, Parlor Restrooms, two Christian Education Stairwells, Sanctuary Doors, and FLC restrooms.

We are very excited to move forward with these renovations and thank everyone who has participated in this process. Our goal throughout the Build-Serve-Grow campaign has been, not only to rebuild the Lord's house, but to serve one another and grow in our love for Christ, our congregation, and the community at large.

The other day I was working on my computer - actually, I was multitasking on my computer. I was working on emails, working on items for the bulletin, preparing my weekly rehearsal order, researching something about a composer, adding dates to the calendar and listening to music. All was going well, until I need to look at something I had first started working on. I clicked the dash at the top right of the screen not to that for which I was looking but to find something else. I had to minimize what seemed like a dozen screens just to get to what I wanted to work on. While I had thought I was being productive, having too many open screens (i.e. windows or apps) kept me from focusing on the main task at hand. It is easy to get distracted when your thoughts aren't completely focused on what you're doing. Whenever we attend a worship service, it's easy to have too many "windows" open. We might physically be in the worship space, but our mind might be on where we're going to have lunch or those things we need to get done before returning to work the next day. The word "worship" can be used as noun or as a verb, so it's not just what we do but also what we do. Through worship we find ways to connect to God. We might connect through the liturgy, the scripture, the sermon or the music. Let's face it, we all have stray thoughts at times during worship. However, we can choose to either keep the windows open or minimize them so we can better focus on listening for God. In a recent anthem the Sanctuary Choir sang, the text says "Listen with your heart...." Maybe it would be better to listen not just with our ears, but with our hearts as well. Our connection to God is beyond just hearing; it's in feeling as well. So the next time you step in for worship, try to minimize those windows that are in your mind. Take a deep breath, clear your head, open your ears and "listen with your heart...."

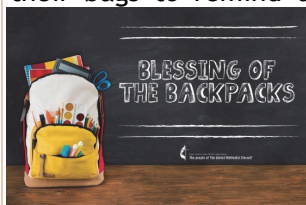
VBS Celebration and Singing in Worship

Methodist Water Project

The Each day there are, on average, 100 people (including infants and children) waiting on the bridge between Matamoros, Mexico, and Brownsville, Texas, legally seeking asylum. There are no water fountains and the shops do not let them come in to fill their water bottles. As they wait for processing, they need water to survive. Pastor Tracey at Westlake UMC (WUMC) has invited us to participate in a partnership with other area churches and churches in Matamoros, Mexico to provide adequate water for these desperate people. As temperatures rise during these summer months, this ministry has become even more critical.

There are 5 churches in Matamoros whose pastors (and members) are very willing and eager to walk out onto the bridge twice daily to bring water to those waiting there. However, they do not have the resources to purchase the water. Given the current need, \$2060.00 will purchase enough water to supply 4-5 bottles of water per person each day for one month. This is really only ½ the ideal amount of water to sustain them, but is very helpful. Each of our area churches have been invited to support this effort by raising and donating \$2060.00 to cover one month's supply of water.

Thanks to your generous donations to our Food Pantry, Manchaca UMC has provided funds to supply one month's worth of water for these desperate people. If you want to individually contribute more, just annotate your donations as "Methodist Water".
