#### A Note from the Minister of Music

ne of the games I often played as a child was Hide and Seek. While most of my friends preferred to be "it" and be the one searching for everyone, I preferred to be one of the ones who tried not to be found. It was challenging to try to find the perfect place to hide and only on the

rare occasion did you remain hidden until the game was called off. No matter how good you thought your hiding place was, a skilled "it" would usually find you. While it would have been nice to have remained hidden, I have to admit there was often as sense of relief once you were found. In the Bible there are stories of "hidden" people. Adam and Eve tried to hide from God; Jonah ended up being hidden in the belly of the big fish; Joseph was hidden in the pit which his brothers dug. God still found Adam and Eve. Jonah escaped the big fish and fulfilled his mission to Nineveh. Instead of keeping him in the pit, Joseph's brothers sold him to the Ishmaelites and off Joseph went to serve God in Egypt. Have you ever felt hidden from God, either by circumstances or by your own choosing? Perhaps you wondered if God would be able to find you. As Adam, Eve, Jonah and many other biblical characters discovered, there is truly no way to hide, or be hidden, from God. God will find us no matter where we are and no matter our circumstances. Whether we're trying to avoid doing something for God or thinking we're keeping something from God, God has a way of putting the right people in our lives or bringing about the right situations that call us from our secluded existence. One thing I learned as child while playing Hide and Seek was that it can sometimes be rather lonely when you're hiding, especially when you're hiding in a dark space. God doesn't want us hiding. God wants us to step out of the darkness and into the light. If you're hiding from God, or feel hidden from God, listen for God's "olly, olly, oxen free" and step out of the dark and into God's light. You know...God is the ultimate "it" and will never stop looking until we're found.

## **35th Year of MUMC Scholarship**



Please give generously to the April 7, 2019 Communion Altar Rail Offering. These monies are designated for the Chris Brown and Don Banker Scholarship Endowment, which gives scholarships to local high school and college students each year. This fund began with \$300 in 1984, 35 years ago. Since that time, over \$66,500 has been given in college scholarships to 135 students.

Like the mustard seed in Matthew 13:32 "although it is the smallest of all seeds, it grows larger than any garden plant and becomes a tree. Birds even come and rest on the branches." With God's blessing and your generosity, the scholarship fund will grow again this year, serve more students, and MUMC will continue to play a vital role in assisting students to achieve their goals and dreams.

It is important for you to know that each and every dollar of all of the offerings for the April 7 Communion Rail will go to the scholarship fund to help students with their college expenses. Please help support our youth in their future endeavors.

#### **History of the MUMC Scholarship Fund**

The MUMC Scholarship Fund began in 1984, when Christine Brown, a longtime MUMC member and retired teacher, was honored by parents of her students. She was recognized with a \$300 check, and her response was "Let's give it back to the children."

Christine had opened Jet Star School after her retirement. These parents wanted to acknowledge her forty years of teaching, devotion to children, and her endless energy, so their \$300 gift was the seed money for the scholarship fund. Christine began to have her famous rummage sales to benefit the scholarship nest egg. She was so successful with her sales, friends and family dubbed her "Queen of the Rummage Sale".

Christine's life revolved around God, her family, MUMC, children, and their educations. Though she is no longer with us, Christine's spirit lives on, and she continues to influence lives through the MUMC Scholarship Fund.

In 1994, another scholarship was added to the MUMC Fund. Janna Banker contributed proceeds from a scholarship established in memory of her husband, Donald. His career had its foundation in an engineering degree from Texas A&M University. After serving in the USAF and working in private industry, he returned to A&M to obtain a master's degree in mathematics, starting a long and distinguished career in education. The majority of his teaching career was spent at McCallum High School in Austin.

Don's passionate belief in higher education and the opportunities it afforded was often the source of his teaching style.

Mathematics was his platform from the very basic algebra to the higher logic of calculus, he urged, pushed, and if necessary, held the hands of students until they understood.

Like Christine Brown, Don Banker's devotion to teaching and his students was reciprocated with admiration and respect.

From the Pastor's Desk...

The word *'tithing'* elicits a mixture of feelings and responses. How do you respond to the biblical teaching of giving 10% of your income back to God? Do you see it as a burden or an opportunity?

We may not always enjoy God's intrusion into our personal finances, but God does have a purpose with this meddling. God asks that we be good stewards of the blessings entrusted to us. In simple terms, we are the caretakers of God's stuff. What we have is not entirely ours; it belongs to God. That means there is a spiritual purpose in our lives and with the wealth generated from our labor.

I like the way Mike Slaughter put it in his book <u>Shiny gods: Finding Freedom</u> <u>from Things that Distract Us</u>. "God doesn't direct us as the church to build cathedrals but to bring our tithe to God's storehouse as God's mean of provision. We are the only hands that God has to rebuild the places long devastated. We are the only feet to carry the good news to the poor. We are the only bank account that God has to save people on the planet. We are it! That's why the tithe matters."

## The Beauty of Stewardship

Stewardship has to do with how we manage our time, talent, resources--basically our entire lives. It's a beautiful concept when properly understood. Here are the basics of good stewardship:

We are blessed by being given the task of managing well all that we have influence over: our lives, our abilities, our minds and bodies, our time, our part of the earth, our finances, our children, our church buildings, our automobiles, etc.

Although we can make decisions regarding each of the above, ultimately we are responsible to God. Sooner or later, we must give an account of our management of God's creation and of God's gifts.

When we properly use the talents, resources and property that God allows us to manage, we find great joy. Think of planting a garden which soon overflows with colorful flowers, wonderful vegetables and flavorful herbs, etc. God gave us the plot of ground, God gave us the seed, God gave us the wisdom and strength to bring forth such beauty, such good things to see or eat, or smell. Yet we did the work, with God's help, to make it a reality. Like Adam we tilled it and kept it. But God gave the increase. God's provisions and our labor brought the garden to its fulfillment.

Good stewardship enables us to do something positive and wonderful with the money God has allowed us to have. What feels better than knowing one has managed money well? Our bank account, our checkbook and our portfolio tell the story. When money is handled well, we have enough for ourselves and are still able to give to God's work.

That is the beauty of stewardship.

- Ages 16-17 may engage in construction work, but are not permitted to use power tools or to work from a height of more than six feet. They must provide their own adult supervision (must be a parent or legal guardian over the age of 21).



Ages 15 and younger are prohibited from working on an active construction site.
