ver the past several weeks, I have seen numerous Facebook posts of friends who have attended the Texas State Fair. Included in these pictures are the iconic Big Tex as well as pictures of the fair food and the Midway. The posts bring back many memories from my childhood. Growing up, my parents would try to take my siblings and I to fair each year, esp. on "German Day." As a bonus, my parents would

also plan on us attending the musical which was playing at the Fair Park Music Hall. I can't remember all the shows we saw, but I do remember being amazed by the sets, the singing, and the spectacle (and the 2-3 hour respite from the Texas October heat wasn't bad either.) While I enjoyed watching the musicals, it wasn't until I was in a musical that I really got hooked and learned to appreciate what goes in to putting on a production. After I was in a production, I gained a better insight into the musical, its characters and its content. Sure it's nice to be entertained by being in an audience, but I learned so much more by being active and involved. While attending a theatrical production often means being a spectator, being in worship really should not. In the average worship service, there are moments when those persons in attendance have an opportunity to actively participate. Singing the hymns/songs, participating in the liturgy, experiencing the sacraments are all ways in which you can actively participate. You can even follow along in the pew Bible while the scripture is being read. How much you get involved in worship is up to you. But wouldn't it be more interesting if you were actively invested in it? Have you ever noticed how quickly time passes when you're actively doing something? Parents discourage their children from becoming "couch potatoes." During worship, God doesn't want us to be "pew potatoes," but wants us to be active in our worship. God doesn't dictate our participation level, but calls us into active worship with our brothers and sisters. Which will you choose? Pew Potato or Active Worshiper?





Harvest Food and FUND DRIVE NOVEMBER 4th-25th

Harvest is the time for gathering crops at the end of the growing season and celebrating the bountiful harvest by giving thanks and enjoying a big feast. Also, most of us take stock of our abundant lives. Yet many of our neighbors struggle to feed their



families on a day-to-day basis. During this harvest season, the Missions Commission invites you to give thanks by sharing your blessings with others in our area who are less fortunate. This may be done through donations of food and money for the Food Pantry.

Though out the year, MUMC Food Pantry provides sacks of food to persons who request aid in the church office. Each sack provides at least three basic meals and costs about \$15 to purchase. During a typical month, 30 sacks of food are given out. We also support the Backpack Ministry at Menchaca and weekend food sacks for Akin's Homeless. This year we added the Blessing Box which enables neighbors in need to get food when the church is not open. During November and December the Food Pantry provides sacks filled with food for a traditional holiday meal.

We encourage you to bring food from the shopping list below and place them in the Hospitality Area or near the stage in the Family Life Center through November 25th. Monetary donations may be made to MUMC and designated for the Food Pantry.
